600 job seekers attend career conference at MCC

As a human resource manager at Klein Steel, Rob Sihto knows exactly what he's looking for and what he's not. "Coming up and chewing gum and not making eye contact and bypassing the person at the booth and going right to the material on the table."

All useful information, especially for middle aged job seekers who may be out of practice.

Job seeker Howard Rudnick said, "I don't have any special skills. I sold furniture for 40 years -- that's all I know."

But employers say talk up the skills you do have and be confident. Sihto said, "We've had great success here. We've been here our third year now. We've seen a lot of great candidates here. RochesterWorks! does a great job sponsoring this event. We've seen, like I said, a lot of great candidates."
