



# Career Advocacy Program

This school-based program will provide case management services to students in their Senior or Junior year of high school who are experiencing barriers to success in the areas of academics, employment and/or their home life. Students should be on track to earn either their *GED, Regents or Local Diploma*. Services to include: collaboration with family members, teachers and support staff; outreach to families in need; and career counseling/job readiness training. Services are provided by Family and Youth Counselors. Students will be required to complete *Individual Service Plans* that they have set with their Counselor which will aid in goal setting/obtaining. Services will articulate between home, high school and CTE. Students will be eligible to apply to RochesterWorks Summer Youth Employment Program, a supported summer work placement. Enrollment is open, so students may sign up at any time during the school year as long as they meet eligibility requirements. Students will continue to receive services until the end of their Senior year and may be eligible to receive services post-graduation.

- The services will be provided to WIA eligible students who attend Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES CTE programs from the 7 school districts in western Monroe County, and/or who attend the BOCES 2 Alternative High School and Westside Academy..

**Target Population: Senior and Juniors who—**

- Are working towards their GED/H.S. Diploma
- Are seeking employment/job readiness skills
- Are seeking college/employment/military post high school.
