



School to Work

School to work is a program that will focus on introducing in-school students to the employment world, at the same time learning basic life skills needed after graduation. The purpose of the program is to provide them with pre-vocational skills including interviewing career exploration, job development, and resume building. With life skills, the students will complete a personal assessment that assists in their development. Other activities will include socialization, financial planning and post-educational options. While in the program students will participate in group discussions as well as 1-on-1 vocational counseling. Students are graded on effort, participation and attendance. Student will also participate in a Person Centered Planning program to assist the student in planning their goals after high school and connecting to resources needed to transition successfully. The students that have done well can then focus on a 5-week internship at an area business of their choice. This internship can take place by the end of the school year or during the summer.
